CEWA Executive Director Dr Debra Sayce presented Noongar woman Shelley Cable (23) with the CEWA Young Leadership Award for her work in Aboriginal empowerment through economic and financial freedom.

She is undertaking CPA studies and is passionate about Aboriginal business and financial inclusion.

Shelley presented recommendations on financial literacy to the UN which were accepted and formally endorsed and she co-directed the social media campaign '100 Days of Deadly Mob', promoting 100 Aboriginal heroes, reaching over one million readers.

Shelley was elected to attend the Uluru Convention on Constitutional Reform, which resulted in forming the Uluru Statement.
